PROOF OF EDUCATIONAL LINKAGE

- * Proof of closure of gaps must fulfill two different criteria.
- Criteria 1 Must be subjective <u>or</u> objective/observable. Subjective = Self-report, intent to change; Objective = Tests, observation, metrics Criteria 2 Must be measurable during or right after the activity <u>or</u> at a future time interval.
- Knowledge = Understanding and having familiarity with facts and/or processes/strategies (measured during or directly after participation in the activity) (Subjective) Learners will self-report an increase in knowledge about XYZ. (Objective) Learners demonstrate increased knowledge XYZ in the learning setting.
- Competence (skill) = Knowing how to do something well; an increase in expertise and skill (measured during or directly after participation in the activity) (Subjective) Learners will self-report that they know how to do XYZ. (Objective) Learners demonstrate/show they can do XYZ in the learning setting.
- **Practice** = Applying/integrating learning to practice/performance in the clinical setting (measured at some interval after participation in the activity) (**Subjective**) Learners will self-report that they have improved practice/performance of XYZ. (**Objective**) Learners demonstrate/show an increase in skill in XYZ.
